



Departure Point:

- Check in is at 9:30AM at the "Guest Services" office in the Whiskeyjack Lodge located at the base of Lake Louise Mountain Resort, 3 kilometres/2 miles north of the Trans Canada Highway on Whitehorn Road.
- All guests must check in and sign a waiver before heading up to the trailhead.
- 10:00AM – Transfer included from Fish Creek parking lot to trailhead near Temple Lodge.
- 3:00PM (upon return from Skoki Lodge) - Bus departs from trailhead for Fish Creek parking lot.

Hiking Directions:

- The trail starts about 100 metres/300 feet up the hill above Temple Lodge.
- The 3-5 hour hike (depending on ability) will take you through spectacular alpine terrain with an elevation gain of 500 metres/1000 feet to a total height of 2485 metres/8200 feet.



Lodging:

- Skoki Main Lodge furnishings include crackling wood stoves, surrounded by numerous historic photos and ski memorabilia.
- Lodging is simple and heat is maintained by woodstoves, coal stoves or propane heaters.
- Lighting includes a variety of lanterns, candles, kerosene lamps. Outhouses are available for toilet facilities.
- Warm wash water is in the drying room. Take water to your room or cabin in the pitcher provided. There is a sink at the end of the hall in the lodge for your dirty wash water. In cabins, please throw the water well away from your building.
- Bedding and towels are provided.

Meals:

- Being active in the fresh mountain air sharpens the appetite, which our homemade meals are sure to satisfy. Homemade baking starts the day accompanied by a hearty breakfast. Lunch is a build-it-yourself affair with a variety of food items suitable for the trail. As you arrive back from your day of exploring, afternoon tea is served including homemade soup and freshly baked goods. Early evening, guests surround the central dinner table next to a buffet, laden with a selection of delicious salads, vegetable dishes and a daily dish of beef tenderloin, lamb, chicken or delectable seafood, bound to please. Desserts follow, with tea, coffee or an after-dinner drink by the fire.

Liquor License:

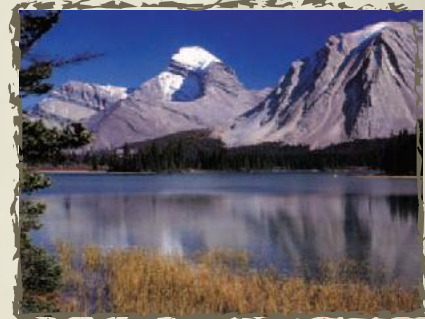
- Skoki Lodge is a licensed facility offering beer and a selection of fine wines – Personal alcoholic beverages cannot be consumed in public areas.



What To Bring:

· Skoki Lodge is located in the backcountry. It is nice to stay for several days in order to explore some of the spectacular scenery this area holds. The only access to the lodge for visitors in the summer is by hiking. Weather in the mountains can be unpredictable, so be prepared. It is suggested that you pack the necessary equipment to make running repairs if required. Other suggested items to include are:

- Packed lunch and snacks for the trail in.
- Windbreaker
- Rain Gear
- Shorts and long pants
- Hats
- Gloves
- Extra socks and shoes
- Sunglasses with UV protection
- Sunblock lotion and lip protection
- Insect repellent
- Indoor shoes or slippers
- First aid kit including tensor bandage
- Cord, pliers, knife, wire and/or duct tape
- Swiss army knife
- Flashlight
- Waterproof matches, toilet paper and/or Kleenex
- High-energy bars
- Daypack
- Camera and film
- Thermos and/or water bottle
- Personal toiletries-toothbrush, comb etc.



Other Considerations:

- Fishing License - A fishing license is required from Parks Canada and is available at: www.parksCanada.gc.ca
- Pets are not allowed at Skoki Lodge
- Bedding - All bedding is supplied including towels.
- Special Meals - At time of booking please advise your reservations agent of special dietary requirements. To be accommodating to the chef, he/she will need at least 14 days advance notice.
